Program: Mike Hayes introduced our guest speaker tonight Tom Brazel. Tom is the Director of International Ministries at ELIM Fellowship. Tom has returned to take over this position once again.



He held it from 1996 to 2001 before going to Africa to minister to the people there. Tom told us of some of the projects that are currently being run through his World

Ministries. The first being the Project Amazon in Brazil. Here they run a number of social ministries the provide work, assistance, services, job/skills training and education to the children and women to help them gain a useful job skill. Another project is the Vie Abondante that is run in Niger. They are trying to start a primary school in Niamey under a former Lima resident Carol Belec. Tom told us of their continuing efforts to help the people of Haiti under the New Life Mission. He then asked Ben Dodzweit to talk to us about the Helimission project

that he is the U.S.A. National Director. The Helimission is to provide assistance to people in remote and inaccessible areas. It is an interdenominational and helps the needy regardless of their religious affiliation. Ben's responsibility is to find pilots in the US who are willing to join this effort. They will fly helicopters from the four bases that are set up now. They are in the countries of Madagascar, Indonesia and Ethiopia. Lance Teitzworth told us about the Rehema Home in Nairobi, Kenya. This is for long term care of the abandoned and orphaned children of this area. They take care of the children until they reach the age of 18. We were also informed of the Bethesda Ministries in Peru, the Family and Marriage Counseling in Viet Nam. The Marine Reach in New Zealand and the Elim Pacific Mission – Oasis House in Guam. Tom told us that he or someone else from the World Ministries team would be glad to come back and talk more to us about anyone one of these projects.
