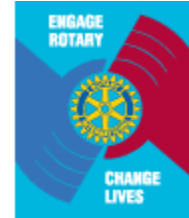

Her business is to have people to help support the families that are in need of someone to care for someone in their family. It can be for a few hours a week or on a full week of help. This is a for profit program but the cost isn't so expensive that that many of the families can afford it. Christina told us that there are about 37 million adults living in the USA which is about 12.8% of our population. By 2030 the 65+ adults will have a 30% increase to that number. Within the next 65 years there will be a 500% increase to those who are over 65. This shows why her business will be one that many of us may want to use or even become an employee for. Christina left each of us her card and a brochure of her business for future needs.
