

Program: Bill Redden introduced our guest speaker tonight AG Chris Rider. Chris is the Assistant Governor for Area 4 which includes the Dansville, Geneseo, Mt. Morris, Nunda and Perry Clubs. He is here to talk to us about the Teresa

House in Geneseo. We were told that Carol Cook is the director and that Dennis Neennan is the Chairman of the Board. Chris told us he started volunteering at the House after his wife passed away a number of years ago. We were advised that the Teresa House is a comfort care home not a hospice home. The difference is the number of rooms you have available for caring for someone as they near the end of their lives. The home is staffed by volunteers except for the director and part time paid nurses. The yearly budget is \$250,000 and about ½ of that is raised by fundraisers and the other half from grants. There is no cost to the residents while they stay at the home. There is also two rooms set aside for family members so they have a place to rest while they are visiting their loved ones. Rose Reynolds joined Chris a related some stories of their time while being volunteers and how it has affected them and the residents. We were asked if we knew of anyone who we thought would make a good volunteer and to pass that name onto Dennis and he will contact them.
